Message from The Chairperson



There is now widespread recognition about the rapidly increasing ageing population in India – a result of the demographic transition, amplified by longevity due to better healthcare. Less known is the distinct 'feminization of ageing' that is taking place, due to the rapid rise in the ageing population and women living longer: a fact already noted in the 2020 'Population Projections for India and States' report. Recognising the importance of this, HelpAge India's 2023 report, 'Women & Ageing: Invisible or Empowered?' delved deeply into this aspect and revealed some of the hard realities older women in India face.

The report brought out the 'unpreparedness and dependency' of older women, with high illiteracy levels, low financial and medical security, lack of awareness on redressal mechanisms and schemes beneficial for them, lack of employment opportunities. All these leave them open and vulnerable to abuse.

Amongst the report's finding 53% of the older women do not feel financially secure. Of the 47% who 'do' feel secure, 80% are dependent on their children for finances. As many as 66% older women in India don't own any assets, and 73% older women do not have any savings. Where digital inclusion is concerned, older women are far behind, with 60% older women having never used digital devices and 59% older women not even owning smart phones.

HelpAge is trying to address the needs of this segment, through its various programmes and services. For example, 64% of elders empowered through our livelihood programme are older women, while under our healthcare programme, 55% of the elderly we serve are older women. Yet, we have a long way to go, as societal mindsets and cultural taboos often prevent them from accessing even basic services.

Meanwhile, for a large majority of disadvantaged and poor elderly, accessing healthcare is a significant challenge, with limited availability, reach and affordability being the issues. One way of addressing the issue is by leveraging technology to provide 'telehealth services'. Another notable initiative, was the launch of the much needed 'K.S.B. Sanyal Centre for Physiotherapy' in Kalyan Ashram, a senior care home run by HelpAge in Kolkata, West Bengal. This new Centre will help elders who are in dire need of physiotherapy and dealing with mobility related challenges.

On the other hand, navigating hospital corridors, its various departments, the registration process, can often be difficult for elders. To address this, we are continuing our efforts in establishing Elder Help Desks at key locations, focusing on geriatric care assistance, with the latest Help Desk being set up at the Jawaharlal Institute of Postgraduate Medical Education & Research (JIPMER) in Puducherry.

We will continue to spread our wings and take a multiservice approach through our various programmes and projects, including focus on mental health, digital safety, caregiver training, livelihood initiatives, helpline services and others.

We also seek to constantly innovate and create platforms where there is cross-learning for both the young and the older generations. We explored such an opportunity by involving school students who took on the role of being digital gurus for the elderly, empowering them with mobile literacy training and helping them learn how to digitally navigate the online world.

None of what we do would have been possible, without the support of our stakeholders such as Government, local bodies and authorities, corporates, individuals, institutions and society as a whole.

A heartfelt thank you to our donors – organisations and individuals - who have stood by us and shown their generosity and sensitivity to the elder cause. It is through your support that we have been able to give elders in need, hope, and help them live active, healthy and dignified lives.

I thank my colleagues in the HelpAge Governing Body and its Committees, who have been actively involved in guiding, assisting and helping the HelpAge team throughout.

Led by its CEO, Rohit Prasad, the HelpAge team across states, spread across the length and breadth of the country, have continued to work with a deep sense of commitment and dedication to the elder cause. After all, alone we can do so little, but together we can do so much.

Message from The Chief Executive Officer



There is a popular saying: “If you want to go quickly, go alone. If you want to go far, go together”. This proverbial truth perfectly encapsulates HelpAge India's journey in its service of disadvantaged elders, which is now in its 46th year. Every service we provide, intervention we do and each programme that we institutionalise keeps elders needs (their voices and choices) at the core; and recognises that to make a truly transformative impact on elder lives, we need to work with the larger community and create innovative avenues of change. This year our focus on catalyzing communities for eldercare through collaborative partnerships has further deepened and expanded.

With Project VayoUday (Eldercare Development) – a unique integrated senior care initiative – we have introduced CARE (Community Action for Relief for Elderly) centres, where we are working with a district level eco-system approach for addressing the overall needs of the elderly related to homes, healthcare, recreation, livelihood along with care & support.

With Project Saarthak (Purposeful), a community-based initiative for the mental well-being of the elderly, we are helping build capacity of non-specialist health workers and community caregivers on geriatric mental health issues (such as dementia, anxiety) towards enabling early identification, diagnosis and linkages/access to counselling and treatment. This initiative aims to build networks of care and support as we engage with multiple stakeholders such as government, mental health institutions, corporate partners, senior citizens' associations and social sector organisations.

Linked to the societal goal of active and productive ageing, and modelled on the same principles of collaborative care, is our 'Active Ageing Centre' in Kerala, launched in partnership with the *Gram Panchayat* (local self-government institution) and a CSR Foundation. The Centre is multi-functional in its objectives aimed at elderly well-being including aspects such as staying physically mobile and mentally active, maintaining social connections, recreation and renewal, doing socially useful work, and gaining useful skills.

Continuing with our inter-generational approach towards building stronger connections between generations, and combined with our digital literacy program, our 'Digital GuruCool' initiative brings young schoolchildren (who are digitally savvy) to share their expertise to upskill elders in their community (many facing the digital divide), teaching them how to navigate the digital world through their smartphones through interactive workshops. These interactions create wonderful intergenerational bonds and new pathways of empathy and togetherness.

As an important priority area, we have also turned the social lens towards one of the most neglected sections of our society – older women - with our landmark research report titled 'Women and Ageing – Invisible or Empowered'. A first-of-its-kind pan-India study, the report highlights the gender inequality gap and the vulnerability elderly women face and suggests some urgent measures that we as a community need to take to improve their quality of life.

These are just a few of the most notable highlights from a year of scaling new heights and expanding our horizons.

Our work is only made possible with the relentless and indefatigable efforts of our teams on ground and the steadfast contributions of our partners and well-wishers. We look forward to your continued support as we chart new paths and create a cosmos of elder-friendly communities with our empowered elders as our guiding stars. Let us take inspiration from the words of Swami Vivekananda: “Arise, awake, and stop not until the goal is reached.”

Telehealth Project

Tech-enabled healthcare



Accessing healthcare is a significant challenge for elders with limited availability, reach, and affordability, creating formidable barriers. In rural India, where 31% of the population must journey over 30 kms in search of healthcare, the struggle is particularly pronounced. Using technology as an enabler, through our pioneering Telehealth Project, HelpAge India is bringing quality healthcare for rural elders in different parts of the country. Working through a hub-and-spoke model, a physician based in an urban area acts as a hub and is connected to 20 villages/locations through a team of health workers and a pharmacist on ground. Free medical consultations and medicines are provided to beneficiaries on a fortnightly basis in needy areas for vulnerable groups.

The tele-consultation model provides great relief to elders, as the paramedical staff is equipped with varied medical testing equipment, which until now was only available at Government health centres. Data capturing becomes easier and is done on a real-time basis. Patients are registered with Unique IDs ensuring that their records are safe and easy to access. The project has not only helped improve the health services in these areas, but has also increased awareness among elder beneficiaries, caregivers and youth, regarding government healthcare schemes for the elderly and preventive healthcare practices.

Project 'VayoUday'

Community-led eldercare



In a significant new initiative for integrated senior care, HelpAge India launched '**Project VayoUday**' in Uttarakhand, Madhya Pradesh and Odisha. The project has two components: addressing shelter needs of disadvantaged elders in partnership with senior citizens' homes and comprehensive district level interventions, where community action is mobilised to provide financial security, digital literacy and access to healthcare for the elderly.

The project is modelled as a 'District Level Comprehensive Elderly Care Intervention' with the establishing of community-led CARE centres (CARE – Community Action for Relief of Elderly) at the village level to address elder issues. Each district also has a helpline, located in one of the CARE centres, with support from district level authorities for the care and welfare of the elderly.

‘Digital GuruCool’ Inter-generational Initiative



Inter-generational initiatives are essential for an age-friendly society, and HelpAge India helps elders become digitally and financially literate, through this very bond of inter-generational exchange. In September 2023, HelpAge launched the 'Digital GuruCool' initiative, combining its Student Action for Value Education (SAVE) and Digital Literacy programme for senior citizens, bringing together both generations, resulting in an enriching exchange of learnings & experiences. Students took on the role of 'digital gurus' teaching senior citizens how to navigate the digital world through their smartphones during on-ground workshops.

These workshops also helped tackle social isolation amongst the elderly and were followed by an interactive entertainment session between students & senior citizens, which brings much cheer to all, strengthening the bond between generations. This initiative has been launched across more than 20 schools since, involving more than 500 school students.

Inauguration of Physiotherapy Centre in Kolkata



HelpAge India established the 'K.S.B. Sanyal Centre for Physiotherapy' in Kalyan Ashram, West Bengal. This brand-new Centre will provide state-of-the-art care for elders who are in dire need of physiotherapy and related physical care. The Centre was inaugurated by Professor Saugata Roy, Member of Parliament, in the presence of Mr. Arun Nanda, Governing Body Member and Mr. Rohit Prasad CEO, from HelpAge India, Mr. Dev Sanyal, CEO of VARO Energy Group and son of Late K.S.B Sanyal, Mrs. Chitra Bhattacharya, Mrs. Debasrita Mukhopadhyay and other family members and friends. The Sanyal family also announced the creation of a fund for the maintenance and upkeep of the facility in memory of Late Sobha Sanyal, K.S.B. Sanyal's wife, who died tragically of cancer in her early 30s.

A man with a magnanimous heart, the Late K.S.B. Sanyal generously donated his property to HelpAge India in 2002, in memory of his father Prof. Somnath Sanyal and his brother Shri Kalyan Kumar Sanyal and helped establish 'Kalyan Ashram', HelpAge India's first Senior Care' Home in July 2008. The title of 'National Ambassador of HelpAge India' was conferred to Mr. Sanyal in 2019, for his outstanding contribution to the elder cause, to which he had dedicated nearly two decades of his life, as Member of HelpAge India's Governing Body.

Launch of Elders Help Desk in Puducherry



Navigating the long corridors of hospitals and medical facilities with their various departments, registration processes, service and testing areas, can be a daunting task for senior citizens. To address this, HelpAge launched an Elders Help Desk at Jawaharlal Institute of Post-graduate Medical Education & Research (JIPMER), Puducherry. The Help Desk, which was inaugurated by Mr. Rakesh Aggarwal, Director, JIPMER, and Mr. Syed Sajjadh Ali, MD, India, Electrical Sector – Asia Pacific,

Eaton, is helping with the end-to-end assistance of senior citizens visiting the hospital. Some of the services being provided by the Help Desk staff are: wheelchair assistance, helping in the registration process, assisting patients in visiting alone to different OPD/departments, collecting reports/medicines on behalf of elderly and providing counselling and guidance.

'Elderpreneurs' Efforts Bear Fruit



Khand Vridhjan, a Cluster Level Federation of 78 Elder-Self-Help-Groups (ESHGs) with over 1000 members, after six years of operating from a rented space is now the proud owner of a fruit and vegetable processing unit in Shimla district with support from Himachal Pradesh State Rural Livelihood Mission. The Federation produces a variety of delectable and healthy products such as jams & pickles etc. The inauguration was attended by Shri Narayan Chauhan, SDM Chaupal and Mr. Vineet Thakur, BDO Chaupal, along with State Rural Livelihood Mission team members and nearly 400 ESHG members.

Caregivers Training Certification with NSDC

We held several sensitization workshops to raise awareness among community and old age homes residents, managers and staff on common mental health issues like depression, general anxiety and dementia. We also conducted similar sessions with Senior Citizens' Associations, where along with gaining information, members also had an opportunity to voice their mental health concerns and receive support.

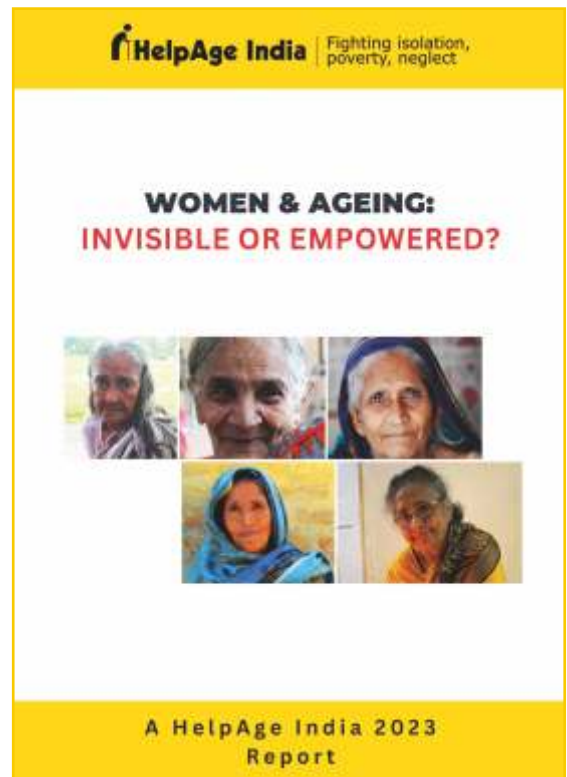
Launch of Report 'Women & Ageing: Invisible or Empowered?'

HelpAge India, marked the UN-designated 'World Elder Abuse Awareness Day' (June 15) with the release of its nationwide report - 'Women & Ageing: Invisible or Empowered?'. A first-of-its-kind report, it explored the aspects of elder abuse and discrimination, access and ownership of older women to financial resources, employment and employability, health care, social and digital inclusion, safety and security, awareness and use of redressal mechanisms and much more.

The survey covered both rural & urban India, spanning across 20 States, 2 Union Territories and 5 Metro Cities, with a sample size of 7911, covering SEC B, C & D categories.

Sharmila Tagore, veteran actor, was Guest of Honour at the event in New Delhi. She spoke about the importance of staying independent and active in later years and not to view ageing as a burden.

Disaster Relief & Rebuilding Support



Natural disasters impacted several elder lives and their communities both in the north and south of country. Chennai and its neighbouring districts experienced the devastating impact from Cyclone 'Michaung', which caused floods and widespread damage. HelpAge India's Disaster Management team was on the ground, providing much-needed healthcare and relief to elders and their community in the most waterlogged areas. Several parts of Himachal Pradesh and Delhi were also affected by severe floods, causing displacement and loss of livelihoods. HelpAge India helped provide immediate relief such as nutrition kits and shelter essentials, as well as, healthcare services.

PROGRAMME HIGHLIGHTS

Supports more than **2 million** elders across the country through its programmes and initiatives.



Operates one of Asia's largest mobile healthcare networks for elders and their community with **164** Mobile Healthcare Units and 10 Stationery Health Units operating across **141** Districts, **8000** Villages in **21** states and **2** Union Territories.



Delivered primary healthcare and health awareness to over **8 lakh** disadvantaged elders and provided **20 lakh** treatments.



Conducted **15** workshops with **724** participants under 'Saarthak - a community-based initiative for Mental Wellbeing of Elderly' which aims to build the capacity of **10,000** community health workers, informal and institutional caregivers, helping them in early identification of mental health issues among senior citizens.



Over **1 lakh** elderly have been provided financial security through its pioneering Elder-Self-Help-Group (ESHG) programme, with the establishment of more than **8500** ESHGs, 70% of which are now functioning independently.



Provided **70,000** physiotherapy treatments to older persons with musculo-skeletal diseases such as back pain, arthritis and other age-related mobility challenges.



7000 elderly from Elder-Self-Help-Groups were provided vegetable seed kits & vermicomposting packets to tide over their livelihood challenges and also help them help with their nutritional needs.



HelpAge has been designated as the National Support Organization for the National Rural Livelihoods Mission (NRLM) and is providing strategic support to the State Rural Livelihood Missions (SRLMs) of West Bengal, Puducherry, Madhya Pradesh and Maharashtra, to further elder inclusion in NRLM.



Conducted **25,632** cataract surgeries through tie-ups with reputed hospitals and medical centres and distributed **29,684** refraction error correction spectacles to elders with weak eyesight.



Supported **1.5 lakh** elders with information, guidance and response, as one of the implementing partners for the national 'Elderline 14567' initiative under the Ministry of Social Justice & Empowerment, Government of India.



Provided Geriatric Care Assistance to elders through the HelpAge Help Desks set up at hospitals, currently operational at AIIMS (Delhi, Rishikesh and Raipur), RGGGH (Chennai), JIPMER (Puducherry) and SGPGIMS (Lucknow).



Runs **8** barrier free homes for the aged in **6** states and supports more than **13** homes for disadvantaged elders across India. Also runs **12** Active Ageing centres in **3** States.



54 Common Service Centres have been institutionalised and linked to CSC e-Governance to connect poor disadvantaged elders to government schemes & services. **5000** rural elderly have been trained under the PMGDISHA Curriculum.



Reached out to over **65,000** senior citizens in a year, through Senior Citizens Associations by conducting more than **3000** workshops on digital literacy & safety, legal & financial awareness, and on the 'Maintenance and Welfare of Parents and Senior Citizens Act'.



HelpAge advocates with the Government for age-friendly policies and laws on old age pension and the National Policy on Senior Citizens.

The Transformative Power of Care

8 5-year-old **Tashi Yangdol's** story is one of resilience, rehabilitation and faith. Widowed at a young age, Tashi spent her youth working as a farm labourer and domestic worker. Over time, with no family of her own and age taking a toll on her body, her situation was getting dire.

HelpAge India's Elder Helpline team in Leh, found out about Tashi's situation and helped rehabilitate her at its Old Age Home in Shey village, Leh. The Mobile Healthcare team helped her gradually regain her strength and mobility.

She was provided with a walker, which she is now comfortably able to move about with. Her positivity and faith are a source of inspiration to all the residents and caregivers. Today, she is a resident of the home and living life free of burden, pain and discomfort – singing, praying and smiling.

“ I was living in extreme poverty without even proper clothes to wear. I was constantly in pain. My parents too had died early, leaving us with a debt to repay. My life was a constant struggle. By the grace of God and the dedicated staff that looks after us, I have everything I need now. This place makes me very happy.

Weaving Independence



6 2-year-old **Kompelli Yadamma** belongs to a traditional weaving community, that goes back generations. She lives in the quiet village of Koyalagudem in the Choutupal district of Telangana, which is 60 kms from Hyderabad.

Her husband passed away when her three children were still very young, which meant that Yadamma had to raise them single-handedly. She somehow managed to do this with her weaving skills with which she creates beautiful handlooms.

Unfortunately, the handloom industry is a precarious one with large periods of uncertainty and meagre income. As a result, they are always struggling to make ends meet.

It was in such a situation that HelpAge India's Livelihood programme provided of succor to Yadamma and as a result her whole family. Elder resource persons from different Elder-Self-Help-Groups (ESHG) in Tirupati, came across, Yadamma and motivated her to join the newly formed 'Shivarama Lingaswamy' ESHG. She also started availing free healthcare benefits from HelpAge India's Mobile Healthcare programme.

Slowly but surely, she emerged from her precarious situation and now leads a life of independence. Today, Yadamma is not just the President of her ESHG but also the Vice President of the Elders' Village Level Federation. She is also an active elder resource person helping empower other disadvantaged elders like her – helping them transform their lives.

Pain Free and Carefree



Meeet **Shanthamma**, a 68-year-old resident of Bengaluru, Karnataka. Hailing from a modest family, Shanthamma started her painful struggle with arthritis when she entered her 60s. Her husband, a welder by profession, worked in the nearby town of Chitradurga, leaving Shanthamma to stay with her son, who made a living through minor painting jobs, for which he could only earn daily wages.

Not wanting to burden her family in any way, Shanthamma managed to get by with the meagre monthly pension that she received. However, a significant portion of this amount was being spent on arthritis medication, leaving little room for other needs.

One day, while visiting the temple near her home, Shanthamma noticed a parked van with a banner announcing free health check-ups. It was HelpAge India's Mobile Healthcare Unit (MHU). Shanthamma shared her health concerns with the doctor, who, after listening to her symptoms, provided her with new medicines and an ointment for her joints.

For the first time in a long while, Shanthamma felt hopeful. The weekly visits to the MHU became a routine, which brought a great source of joy and newfound independence to Shanthamma, who no longer had to spend her pension on medication. She now began to contribute the saved money towards her family's needs. By removing this financial stress, the MHU was not only helping with her physical health, but also her emotional and mental well-being.

The pain in her joints has now significantly reduced, and she is able to walk with a renewed sense of freedom. Her transformation is a testament to the power of accessible healthcare, offering hope and relief to elders in need.

The compassionate Shanthamma has been telling all her elder friends, neighbours and relatives about this life-transforming journey - urging them all to come with her to the MHU to live a pain-free and carefree life!

Advocating for Digital Safety

From Abandonment to Abundant Joy

Life has dealt 70-year-old **Shivpatiya Devi** with several crippling blows, but she has emerged from them with resilience and positivity. Hailing from Chhapra village in Bihar, she was a homemaker, living a simple contented life with her husband and son. The first blow to her independence and dignity came in the form of an accident in which her right leg was gravely injured. With continuous treatment she managed to get back on her feet, but the leg did not heal completely. She somehow taught herself to manage with limited mobility.

The next blow was dealt by her own son, who after the death of his father five years ago, refused to take care of her. Luring her out of the house on a false pretext, he took her to Patna railway station and abandoned her there. When the HelpAge India team first encountered her, Shivpatiya Devi was unable to walk and moved around by dragging herself across the floor. The team helped her by providing shelter at the HelpAge run Sahara Old Age Home in Patna, now.

The next urgent need was to restore her dignity and mobility. Through Project 'Sugamya', she was provided a wheelchair, which enabled her to move around freely once again, with less effort. The mobility aid has not only improved her physical well-being, but has brought a marked improvement to her mental well-being as well. She has gained a lot of confidence and looks forward to each day with renewed hope.





Reclaiming Rights and Dignity

Sena Bai, a 74-year-old resident of Village Badpipli in Dhar, Madhya Pradesh, had been living under distressing circumstances. Despite being in her own home, her life was filled with hardship, primarily due to the neglect and verbal abuse meted out by her own son. During a routine visit by one of HelpAge India's staff members, it was discovered that Sena Bai was not being provided with adequate food, and her basic needs were being neglected by her son.



Additionally, she was suffering from a visual impairment that further exacerbated her vulnerability.

During the home visit, Sena Bai shared her plight, revealing the troubling behaviour of her son. The situation took a darker turn when it was revealed that her son had illegally transferred her property in his name, further isolating her from her rights and security. Despite being informed about her legal options under the Maintenance and Welfare of Parents and Senior Citizens Act, 2007, Sena Bai was reluctant to take legal action against her son, fearing the potential consequences and preferring to resolve the matter within the family.

Our staff member promptly raised a complaint with the HelpAge India helpline, triggering a swift response from the team. A helpline counsellor visited the village to understand the situation in detail, engaging with other elderly members of the community to gain insights. The counsellor then conducted a session with Sena Bai's son, addressing the neglect and urging him to fulfil his responsibilities towards his mother. After the session, the son agreed to take better care of his mother, committing to ensuring her well-being.

To address her visual impairment, Sena Bai was referred to the District Hospital for a cataract surgery. The surgery was successful, significantly improving her quality of life. The helpline counselor provided Sena Bai with contact details for her to reach out at anytime, ensuring she could reach out for help if needed and arranged for continued follow-up visits by the HelpAge Mobile Healthcare and field staff. Truly a heart-warming story of holistic care and support.

Reuniting Loved Ones



On a warm summer day, our Tamil Nadu Helpline-cum-Help Desk staff received a distressing call from the traffic police. They had encountered an elderly man, found wandering the streets alone, and requested our assistance in providing him with shelter. Our social worker promptly responded to the call and arrived at the scene to assess the situation. The elderly man – later identified as **Vembuli** (name changed) – appeared to be around 70 years old and was suffering from progressive dementia, resulting in severe memory loss. His responses to questions were fragmented and incoherent, indicating his vulnerable mental state.

Our team initiated a police memo and transported Vembuli to a partner Senior Citizens' Care Home for immediate shelter. During the journey, Vembuli provided some surprising information—he mentioned that he was a retired government employee receiving a monthly pension. This new detail prompted us to dig deeper into his background.

The team coordinated with the police to check for any missing person reports in the area, as Vembuli vaguely mentioned his address being nearby. Their persistence paid off when we discovered that a missing complaint had indeed been filed at the police station. Armed with this information, the team immediately took Vembuli to the station.

Upon arrival at the police station, the officers promptly informed his family members about his whereabouts. In a heart-warming turn of events, several family members rushed to the station as soon as they received the call. The emotional reunion that followed was overwhelming—Vembuli's family recognised him instantly and were moved to tears, having feared the worst during his absence.

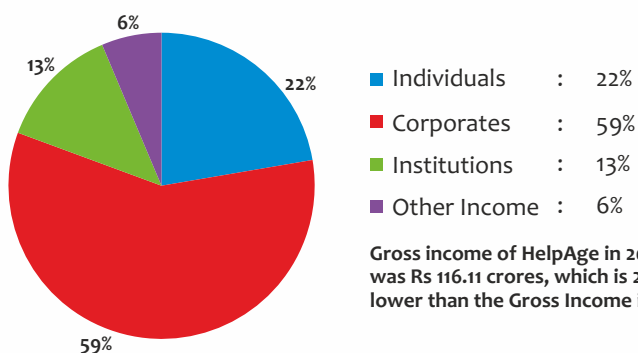

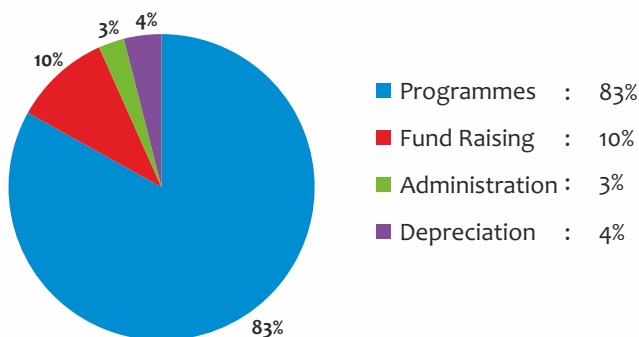


Where our money came from

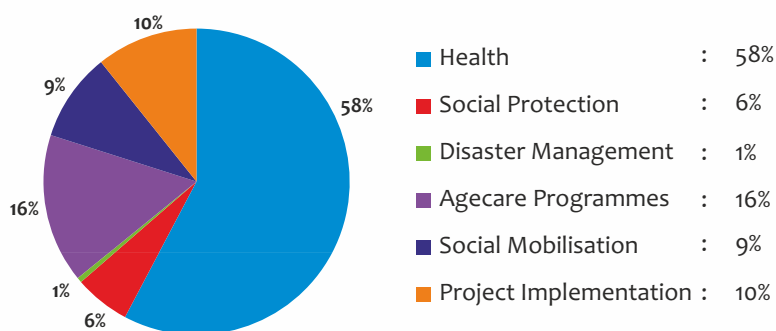


Gross income of HelpAge in 2023-24 was Rs 116.11 crores, which is 2.64% lower than the Gross Income in 2022-23
